

QUAKERS BEATEN IN GOLF CONTEST

New York Captures Lesley Cup
in Intercity Competition
at Boston.

BIG LEAD IN MORNING PLAY

Metropolitans Secure Early Advantage
Which Philadelphians Fail to Over-
come—Medal Score Below Form.

BOSTON, Mass., Oct. 26.—The New York golfers scored an easy victory over the Philadelphians for the Lesley Cup at Clyde Park to-day, winning eight out of ten matches in the morning, and thus giving them a lead which the afternoon foursomes could not affect. The result of the latter contest was all in favor of New York, the Philadelphians failing to win a match. The summary of the morning's play follows:

Philadelphia, after the signal defeat which it administered to Boston yesterday, was thought to be strong enough to give the Metropolitan team a good battle. As it turned out, however, only two of the Quaker City aggregation were able to win their matches—E. A. Service, the young golfer, and J. S. Alcorn, both substitutes, defeating Fred Herreshoff and Ralph Peters. Service won from Herreshoff by 2 up and 1 to play, while Alcorn defeated Peters by the same score.

McFarland gave Travers a very hard match, which the New Yorker finally won by only 1 up. For the most part the matches were closely contested. Walter J. Travis, Captain of the Metropolitans, won from the Philadelphia Captain, H. W. Perrin, by 4 up and 2 to play, and Findlay S. Douglas beat Dr. Simon Carr, the strong Philadelphia player, by 2 and 1. The Philadelphians changed their makeup somewhat, putting in S. S. Kemble against John M. Ward. The veteran baseball player, however, had little trouble in winning, defeating Kemble by 2 and 1.

The medal scoring was not up to the possibilities of the New York team, but the golf throughout was good, and the gallery that followed the different matches was well repaid for the tramp over the course.
