Lakewood to Open Season in April-Lesiey Cup Match.

With the announcement yesterday by Leighton Calkins, Secretary of the Metropolitan Golf Association, of fixtures for three big local tournaments, the golfing fraternity will at once proceed to get busy in preparation for the various events that always demand their attention and Mr. Calkins has assigned the dates skill. of April 23, 24, and 25 to the Lakewood Country Club for its annual open Spring tournament; July 2, 3, and 4 for Apawamis for its popular competition at Rye, and Oct. 2 and 3 for the tri-city team competition for the Lesley Cup.

The course for the Lesley Cup match has not been selected, but it will be dein a short termined time. The Englewood golfers offered their links to the Metropolitan Association at recent the annual meeting. It is a long eighteen-hole course and was the scene of the National championship two years ago, and there is no doubt that its selection will meet with general favor.

This tri-city tournament, in which New York, Philadelphia, and Boston are the contenders, will be played much earlier this year than hitherto. In the past three years it has come toward the close of the regular golf season, but a demand has been made by the metropolitan players for an earlier date this year for the sake of the better turf and more satisfactory playing conditions than are usually ob-tained later in the season. The tourna-ment is held in rotation in the different cities, and this year New York holds and this year New York holds nor. The metropolitan players have the honor. The metropolitan players have held the trophy ever since it was of-fered, and they expect to put another

winning team in the field in October. The Lakewood tournament will vir-tually open the golf season in the North. something which the New Jersey Club has done for many years. Some of the local golfers who have been keeping in practice during the Winter on Southern links will appear among the lists for the prizes, and the field is sure to be a a large and representative one. The qualifying round on the first day will doubtless be thirty-six holes, sets of sixteen qualify-ing in three divisions for the match play rounds, and the customary eighteen-hole Although the official dates have not been awarded for the Garden City tourna-ment, the latter club is planning to hold to a big event immediately atter Lakewood, protably coming on May 7, 8, and 9. Nearly all of the local clubs are getting ready for the playing season. For Hills Nearly all of the local clubs are getting ready for the playing season. Fox Hills is to open its links on Staten Island in April, and the majority of the metropoli-tan clubs will be in full swing by the end of that month or early in May. The Yountakan Club of Nutley has just ar-ranged its dates for a series of team matches with the Ridgewoods, North Jer-sey Country, and Hackensack Golf clubs, the first game to be played with Ridge-wood on the Yountakah links, May 2. The Wykagyl Golf Club of New Rochelle, which has just purchased the property on which its eighteen-hole course is laid out, somewhat over 100 acres, will take a more active part than ever in local golf, and the committee is now at work arranging dates for members' handicaps and team matches.
