Colburn, Evanston, Ill., Golf Club. who was beaten in the first round last year by Miss M. Phelps. Country Club of Brookline; Miss E. Turner, Exmoor Country Club, High-land Park, Ill.; Mrs. E. C. Nesbitt, Wood-stock, Canada, and Miss Florence Harvey,

Hamilton, Ontario. Since the annual meeting of the United States Golf Association last Winter Secretary Watson's staff has been compiling a list of clubs in the United States that have golf links, but are not members of the National organization. It ran up to nearly 600 clubs. The work was necessary owing to a resolution passed at the meeting to mail to every such club a copy of the new constitution and bylaws, and a letter cailing attention to the advantages of belonging to the United States vantages of belonging to the United States Golf Association. The communications are now in the mails, and as a result many new members are expected, but whether this consummation is realized or not the Executive Committee feels that the campaign of education will have a good effect in advancing the general interest among the clubs in the National organization and its methods.
