

BAY STATE GOLFERS WIN

Leslie Intercity Cup Goes to Massachusetts Men.

TRAVIS AND TIFFANY WIN

New York Players Show Poor Form in Match Play for Trophy at Hamilton.

Hamilton, Mass., Oct. 1.—The Metropolitan Golf Association sent one of the weakest teams it ever mustered for a Leslie Cup competition to Myopia today, and as a result received a sound thrashing at the hands of the Massachusetts Golf Association. When the singles had been decided in the early hours the count read 8 to 2 in favor of Massachusetts—no decisive that the usual afternoon foursomes were unexciting. The Leslie Cup will now go to Massachusetts, after having rested in the vicinities of New York without molestation since 1905.

The only winners on the visiting team were Walter J. Travis, the captain, and Gilman P. Tiffany, a former champion of the Hudson River Golf Association. Travis had a better time disposing of T. M. Clafflin, but the Bowdoin golfer finally won by the narrow margin of 1 up.

Neither unexpected the defeat of Fred Herreshoff, the metropolitan champion, at the hands of T. W. Whittemore. In the recent national championship tournament at Brookline Herreshoff defeated Whittemore in the second round, but to-day the former Harvard athlete won by a 2 and 2 margin. J. D. Anderson, an erstwhile Massachusetts champion, beat Findlay S. Douglas 2 up and 1 to play, while W. R. Tuckerman, the Stockbridge golfer, who reached the semi-final stage of the national tournament, had as easy time at the expense of Oswald Kirby, the Englewood trooper holder.

John M. Ward proved a stubborn opponent for Percival Gilbert, but the Boston golfer finally won after two extra holes. H. Schmidt beat Archie Reid, the Hudson River Golf Association star, who had a narrow margin in the recent international championship tournament, made nine straight holes at J. F. Shanley, Jr., the Deal Golf and Country Club's leading amateur.

Tom Stevenson, one of the Massachusetts substitutes, eliminated Max Behr, the New Jersey champion, in a nine-hole match. The Bay State team lost three of the five foursome matches to New York in the afternoon play, but had obtained such a lead in the singles of the morning that cup would have been secure had all five matches gone to the visitors.

SOCIETY AT HORSE SHOW

Goodly Crowd of Spectators Enjoys Montclair Exhibition.

BROOK FARM ENTRIES WIN

Well filled classes and well filled boxes made the horse show which was held at Montclair yesterday one of the successes of the season. One's first impression on leaving hand had planned, and executed, for the evidence of it was everywhere apparent, from the tiers of boxes draped in blue and yellow, the club colors, which was an innovation, to the new parking spaces, which were filled with road coaches and automobiles.

The Brook Farm horses, which swept the first break at Montclair, continued their successes uninterrupted yesterday, until the class for pairs over 15 hands was reached, and here they met their Waterloo. It was not that Rex and Ramapo did not outclass every other entry, but Francis Ware, who judged alone in all of the classes, must have detected a slight lameness in the ankles of the pair, and appeared in the class for Mr. Ware sent them from the ring, and gave the blue to J. The little mare is not a brilliant performer, but she has the first requisite of a perfect road horse—extreme speed—and she has never yet been defeated in her class.

Good old Trampus added another blue to the Brook Farm's string, in the class for runabout horses, but none of the entries was particularly formidable, although the class was large. Snippy gave a good performance, and it looked as though he might carry off second honors, but to the surprise of the spectators, he failed to score. The exhibition of draft horses brought out a crowd of onlookers. Prince Morris was a fine lot as ever faced the judges in Madison Square Garden. John Blondel had a pair of black geldings called Dan and Charlie in this class, and they were so trimmed up with ribbons, straw and other things more or less ornamental that it was almost impossible to tell just what they were like. Jack, from the stable of J. Newton Rodgers, however, on account of their length of neck, although the consensus of opinion was that the latter pair were more imposing.
