

# AMATEUR GOLFERS TO PLAY FOR CUP

## Annual Tri-State Tournament for Lesley Trophy Starts Tomorrow at Noble

### Cream of Pennsylvania, Metropol- itan and Massachusetts Will Tee Off in Two Days' Match

Arrangements have been completed for the eighth annual tri State tournament for the Robert W. Lesley Cup between the Pennsylvania, Metropolitan and Massachusetts Golf Associations, to be played on the course of the Huntingdon Valley Country Club, Noble, tomorrow and Saturday.

The selection of the Pennsylvania players has been no easy task for the committee, and although fifteen men have been placed on the eligible list, the actual team will not be selected until some time today, when the players will meet at Huntingdon Valley and play off for the places on the team. The Metropolitan Association is in a like predicament but has selected ten certainties, with four men to play off for the last two places. The Massachusetts has experienced no such trouble and the twelve men chosen have promised to play. Last year the Metropolitan wrested the championship from Massachusetts at the Nassau Country Club, and it is now up to Pennsylvania to capture it from their rivals. All three associations are represented by very strong teams, although according to the United States Golf Association handicap list the Metropolitan hold an overwhelming advantage on paper. Jerome D. Travers, the national champion, Oswald Kirkby and Fred Herreshoff are all scratch men, while neither Pennsylvania nor Massachusetts has a scratch man on the list.

With the advantage of playing over a home course, Pennsylvania should put up a strong fight, but there is no denying the fact that they are up against a stiff proposition. Twelve singles will be played each morning and six two-ball four-somes in the afternoon on each day.

On Sunday the players of each association will be the guests of the Golf Committee of the Merion Cricket Club to try out the new course at Haverford, and they will be entertained at lunch by Robert W. Lesley, the donor of the Lesley Cup. Howard W. Perrin, F. S. Wheeler and F. H. Jacques, the presidents of the Pennsylvania, Metropolitan and Massachusetts Golf Associations, respectively, have also accepted an invitation to be present.
