

GOLF TITLE FOR QUAKER EXPERTS

Pennsylvanians Defeat the Gothamites for Leslie Cup Eleven Matches to Four

Probably the greatest surprise of the present golf season was sprung at the Huntingdon Valley Country Club, Noble, yesterday, when the Pennsylvania Golf Association overwhelmed the Metropolitan Golf Association in the inter-city matches for the Robert W. Lesley Cup by eleven matches to four. The result was entirely unlooked for and reflects all the greater credit on the Pennsylvania team, who thus captured the trophy for the first time in the history of the competition.

It had been confidently expected that the Metropolitan would successfully defend the cup against the Pennsylvanians, although the latter had been expected to put up a really good fight. As a result the doubles matches in the morning, which were won by Pennsylvania by the narrow margin of one match, there was nothing in it, and even then the New Yorkers were expected to win a majority of the singles contests in the afternoon. They signally failed in their purpose, and thereby hangs a tale. Findlay Douglas had promised all the New York men to stake them to a dinner if they won, but whether the thought of the spread they were to be given affected their play or not, the fact remains that they were snowed under. The success of the Pennsylvanians put all the men in high feather and probably there was no more delighted man present than Mr. Lesley himself.

The same program was followed as on the first day, the two-ball foursomes being played in the morning and the singles in the afternoon. Every match of the doubles was close and interesting, but probably the most surprising result was sprung by W. C. Fownes, Jr., and G. A. Ormiston, when they defeated Jerome D. Travers and A. M. Reid 2 up and 1 to play. W. P. Smith and E. Satterthwaite formed a good partnership and were 3 up and 1 to play on Max Bear and G. Waldo. The other Pennsylvania success was gained by H. B. McFarland and W. L. Thompson, who defeated E. M. Wilde and G. P. Tiffany, 3 up and 2 to play. An intensely interesting match between F. Herreshoff and Oswald Kirby and E. M. Byers and H. W. Perrin resulted in a victory for

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Herreshoff and Kirby, 1 up. C. B. Buxton and R. Mott succumbed to F. S. Douglas and J. M. Ward and were 2 down at the finish.

The match of the singles that attracted the greatest attention was that between E. M. Byers and Jerome Travers. A big gallery followed the match and followed every stroke with the keenest interest. Starting out, each got a five on the first hole and Travers drew first blood by taking the second hole, but Byers squared matters on the next hole with a five to six. Travers again took the lead on the fourth, but a "birdie" on the fifth by Byers squared the match again. Of the next four holes Travers won two and Byers won one and one was halved, so that at the turn Travers was 1 up. He increased his lead at the tenth and the next three holes were halved. A four to five for Travers on the fourteenth made him 3 up and 4 to go, and it looked all up with Byers. On the fifteenth hole, however, Byers was down in three, one under par, to four, and on the next two holes Travers got into quite a little trouble and took two sevens to a six and a four, and the match was square again. The eighteenth was halved in par four, but the nineteenth settled the match, Byers getting a par four to the five of Travers.

Another notable victory was gained for Pennsylvania by E. Satterthwaite, who defeated Max Behr, 6 up and 5 to play. At the turn Satterthwaite was only one up, but coming in he went like a blue streak and played the tenth, eleventh, twelfth, thirteenth and fourteenth holes in par and it was no wonder that Behr lost each one of them. H. W. Perrin and F. S. Douglas played a most exciting match. At the turn Perrin was one up, but so evenly were the men matched that when the eighteenth was reached the match was all square. Perrin settled matters on the nineteenth by a "birdie" to Behr's four.

The other very close matches were also played. Richard Mott defeated G. P. Tiffany on the eighteenth green and C. B. Buxton gaining a similar over E. M. Wild. Buxton with a 76 was only one stroke above the score he made yesterday against H. W. Stucklen. H. B. McFarland was 2 up at the turn on J. M. Ward and maintaining his lead he finally won 2 up and 1 to play. G. A. Ormiston played very fine golf against A. M. Reid and won with the greatest ease 5 up and 4 to play. Fred Herreshoff and Oswald Kirkby were the only two New Yorkers who won their matches, Herreshoff beating W. C. Fownes, Jr., 4 up and 3 to play, and Kirby beating W. P. Smith, 2 up.
