

# BOSTON GOLFERS DEFEAT PHILLIES

## Capture Second Leg on Lesley Cup in Final Round by 12-3--Ouimet Loses

BOSTON, Mass., Sept. 27.—The Massachusetts golfers won their second leg on the Lesley Cup today by beating the visiting Philadelphians, 12 to 3, in the final round. The Bay State team was unbeatable in the morning foursomes, taking all five of the matches as against only two of the five played against New York yesterday. In the afternoon the Philadelphians did some winning, but they started to play with the necessity to win eight of ten matches to beat the home players. They fell far short of this, winning only three matches, Massachusetts taking seven.

The only satisfaction the Philadelphia players had was that R. S. Worthington was able to beat the young open champion, Francis Ouimet, who disposed of Jerome Travers in an extra hole match yesterday. Worthington had to play no brilliant golf to beat the champion, who plainly showed the strain that he recently has been under. Ouimet was not up to his game today and was generally out-golfed by his opponent. At that, however, he played hard, and Worthington's victory over him was only 1 up.

R. E. Hansen also was able to beat W. C. Chick, this match being close and being won 1 up also. The third match taken by the visiting team was by Fritz Sargent, who beat Massachusetts' tenth player, B. S. Evans. This match, like the two others, was decided by the smallest margin—1 up. Most of the other matches in singles were easy for the Massachusetts team, the closest being that between J. G. Anderson and H. W. Perrin. This match required two extra holes, Anderson then beating his Philadelphia opponent at the 20th hole. H. Schmidt beat W. E. Satterwaite 3 and 1, which also was H. H. Wilder's score against C. B. Buxton. P. Gilbert had little trouble to dispose of F. W. Kemble, winning 5 and 4. S. K. Sterne took his match from G. A. Crump, 4 and 3, the Massachusetts team's most one-sided win being that of A. G. Lockwood over S. Sharwood, 6 and 4. R. W. Brown beat W. P. Smith, 4 and 2.

In the morning foursomes Francis Ouimet, national open champion, and W. C. Chick won their match from H. W. Perrin and R. S. Worthington at the home holes. H. Schmidt and S. K. Sterne, the Worcester pair, also won at the last hole. P. W. Whitmore and H. H. Wilder beat C. B. Buxton and Fritz Sargent of Pennsylvania, by 3 up and 2 and R. W. Brown and F. H. Hoyt scored a win over W. P. Smith and F. W. Kemble by the same margin. Arthur Lockwood and Percy Gilbert scored a win over G. A. Crump and R. E. Hanson by 3 and 1.

Ouimet and Chick played poorly for their first nine holes against Perrin and Worthington, their putting being away off color. The Boston pair stood 3 down at the turn, going out in 43, while their opponents were three strokes better. Ouimet's tee shot to the tenth was perfect, his ball landing within two feet of the hole, which left Chick an easy putt. The Boston pair, after halving the next hole, won the twelfth in 3 to 4 and lost the 13th. It became two down at the 13th. The 14th was halved in 6, the putting of both Ouimet and Chick being anything but good, while Perrin and Worthington took turns in visiting traps. Ouimet and Chick won the 15th and 16th, squaring the match. They also won the home holes, 5 and 6, and the contest by 1 up.
