H. JACQUES STILL FOR THE FOURSOME

Massachusetts Golf Association President Expected to Bar Way to Change in Lesley Cup Play.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Sunday.—Said Pacha, formerly Grand Vizier, died here today.

Dismissal and reinstatement to power were frequent occurrences with Said since his first appointment as Grand Vizier in 1879.

It had been asserted that Said's character was dissimilar to that of the average Turkish official. Though a master of diplomacy, he was never accused of being an intriguer. He was described as being absolutely incorruptible.

During the crisis in 1908, brought about by the Young Turk party demanding a constitutional form of government, Sultan Abdul Hamid dismissed Said Pacha and made Said Pacha Grand Vizier. Said had been out of office for some time previously.

His tenure of the vizierate, however, was short, for in the reconstruction of the government the Young Turks demanded his resignation, declaring he was too steeped in the old traditions to realize the aspirations of the new party which had come into power as the result of Abdul Hamid's restoring the constitutional form of government.

Said resigned on August 5, 1908, and Kiamil Pacha, who throughout his career had struggled for a constitutional régime, succeeded him. Said later was elected president of the Senate and in April, 1909, sat as president of the National Assembly which voted to depose Abdul Hamid.

In September, 1911, Said again became Grand Vizier on the resignation of Hakkil Bey. Three months later his Cabinet resigned, but Said was reappointed and held the post until July, 1912, when his Cabinet and Said Pacha assumed the vizierate. Since then Said Pacha held only one office, president of the Council of State.

He was born about 1830.

In the opinion of several well known metropolitan golfers there is not likely to be a return to four ball matches in the intercity competition for the Lesley Cup this year at least.

The Massachusetts Golf Association, with Herbert Jaques at its head, effectively bars the way to such a change. Here is what Mr. Jaques had to say to the golfers of Massachusetts on the Lesley Cup question during the annual dinner, held recently:

"You have probably noted in the magazines and newspapers the discussions of Leighton Calkins, who criticises the actions of the trustees of the Lesley Cup, the details of which are controlled by the Massachusetts, Metropolitan and Pennsylvania associations. The Pennsylvania team is in favor of the four ball, but last year's Metropolitan team voted to keep the foursomes over the four ball. Notwithstanding what has been said, we do play foursomes in Massachusetts, and the executive committee believes that it is for the best interests of the game and the best test of team play in golf. I am personally strongly in favor of the foursomes and the 1913 Massachusetts team unanimously favored that game."

Only the unanimous vote of the presidents of the three associations can change the conditions of play, and as long as Mr. Jaques holds out it does not matter if there are five hundred golfers in Pennsylvania and the metropolitan district, headed by the presidents of the respective associations, in favor of substituting four ball matches for the foursomes.

Should Mr. Jaques adhere to that opinion, there is nothing for it but to get ready for the foursomes.
