## TO ENLARGE N. Y. A. C.

**More Members Wanted and the Entrance Fee to be Reduced.**

William H. Page, President of the New York Athletic Club, yesterday issued a call for a special meeting, to be held in the city clubhouse on the night of Oct. 13, at which time action will be taken on the Board of Governors' recommendation to change the constitution so that the resident membership can be increased from 3,000 to 4,000. This recommendation is expected to meet with the approval of the members, for the increased membership will facilitate the important changes which have been planned in both the city clubhouse and the Summer home at Travers Island. These changes include the reclamation of some fifteen acres of land under water at Travers Island.

Until the 4,000 resident membership has been attained and there is a waiting list of 100, the entrance fee will be reduced to \$100, but when the full list has been reached the fee will revert to \$200.

### Millrose Athletes Compete.

Scratch men had to go without a first place in the final outdoor members' games of the Millrose Athletic Association, which was held on the outdoor field at Astor Place and Broadway yesterday afternoon. Owing to darkness stopping the program with one event still to compete, the meet was postponed until next week, when the point winners for the season will be known and the prizes distributed.

The three-mile handicap race for seniors furnished an interesting battle between Willie Kyronen, the scratch man; Charles Pores, and Nick Gianakopoulos, the hardy distance runner. Pores showed a greater finishing sprint, winning from Kyronen by twenty yards, with Gianakopoulos five yards behind the latter.
