**NEW YORK LOSES
LESLEY GOLF CUP**

Metropolitan Team Is Defeated by Massachusetts on Brookline Links by 9 to 6.

[SPECIAL DESPATCH TO THE HERALD.] BROSTON, Mass., Saturday.—Massachusetts won the Lesley Cup to-day by beating the metropolitan team by a score of 9 to 6. The Bay State golfers' victory was well earned, after winning four of the five foursomes they divided the points in the singles contests. The only pair to lose for Massachusetts was Sanford K. Sterne, of the Tuthuck Country Club, of Worcester, and William C. Chick, of the Country Club. They were beaten by John G. Anderson, formerly of the Bras Burn Club, now a member of the Swanwy Club, of Mount Vernon, N. Y., and John M. Ward, of Garden City, L. I.

The most important contest in the foursomes had Ray Gorton, of Bras Burn, and "Fred" J. Wright, Jr., of the Albermarle Club, of Newtonville, opposed to A. F. Kammer and R. D. Webb. The first couple won by 3 and 2 after being 2 up at the turn. Mr. Gorton held his iron shot to the tenth in this match, the ball hitting the green six feet short of the pin and then rolling in.

R. W. Estabrook and C. M. Amory were close to an interesting match in this form of play from Dwight-Partridge and F. W. Dyer by 1 up.

With a lead of four points to one and ten singles matches to be played the chances for easy victory for Massachusetts looked very bright, but it was not until darkness settled over the links that the Bay Staters were sure of a victory. The first four matches netted the metropolitan players four points, but in the next six, the home golfers asserted themselves and had seven and a half and five wins.

Jose P. Guilford, Massachusetts amateur champion, and Oswald Kirkby, the metropolitan and New Jersey title holder, had a rather close contest, with the latter leading by 2 up after nine holes had been completed. The next three holes were halved and Mr. Guilford won at the thirteenth, but Mr. Kirkby brought the match to an end at the seventeenth by getting a 3 to his opponent's 4.

The game was played on the international field and was one of the most closely contested in some time. It was to have been played in June, but the departure of several players for their commands on the border caused the postponement of the game.
