

# PICK LESLEY CUP PLAYERS.

## Marston Only Prominent Golfer Missing from New York Team.

Still withholding the name of the twelfth member of the New York team of golfers who will be entered against the Pennsylvanians and Bay Staters Friday and Saturday in the Lesley Cup matches at Southampton, the Metropolitan Golf Association last night made known eleven of the district leaders who will play. Unfortunately Max R. Marston, New Jersey champion, is still missing. This metropolitan player has recently been reported to have decided to pool interests with his Philadelphia friends for the matches and play on the Quaker dozen, and as yet no definite decision is forthcoming to settle the misgivings among New Yorkers.

Findlay S. Douglas will again captain the metropolitan team, and will have for a backing all the stars of the district, excepting Marston. John G. Anderson of Siwanoy is undoubtedly the choice for No. 1 man, with Oswald Kirkby, metropolitan champion, close behind him. Others are as follows: A. L. Walker, Jr., the Columbia University student, present intercollegiate champion and runner-up to Kirkby in the metropolitan title play; A. F. Kammer, Baltusrol; Grant Peacock, Princeton; W. M. Reekie, Lakewood, winner early in the season; Gardiner W. White, Nassau champion; John N. Stearns, Jr., Nassau; Jess W. Sweetzer, Ardsley; Frank Dyer and Archie McIlwaine.

The New Yorkers will meet strong opposition on the opening day at the National links. The draw bucks them against the strong Pennsylvania group headed by S. Davidson Herron, national amateur champion, on Friday and the winner of this match will meet the Massachusetts team on Saturday. The downcasters were suddenly weakened when it was announced this week that Francis Quimet would not be able to compete.
