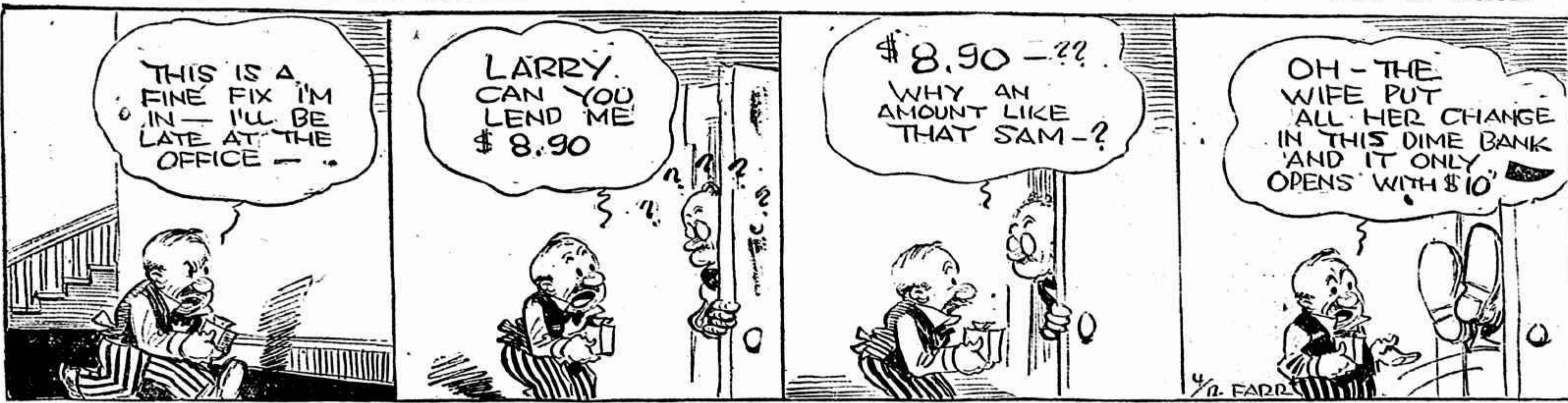


Track at Antwerp Will Be Fastest Ever Built for Olympic Meet

COLD WEATHER HAMPERS TIGERS

Coach Fitzpatrick's Track Athletes Unable to Do Outdoor Training.

PRINCETON, Monday.—Keene Fitzpatrick has been facing a severe handicap in the nature of an unreasonable weather as could possibly prevail in his attempt to condition his track men for the coming University of Pennsylvania relay games, get the men have made considerable progress during the past week. EXPECT NEW OLYMPIC MARKS

Track at Antwerp Will Be Faster Than Course Built for the Stockholm Meet.

The possibility of new records in the coming Olympic games at Antwerp appears bright so far as track conditions are concerned. The contractor who has completed the stadium running track, which will be approximately 400 metres in circumference, states that it will be faster than the course which he built for the Stockholm games in 1912. This information is contained in a letter received by the American Olympic Committee from its special representative, who has just completed an inspection of the stadium, and Antwerp in general, under instruction to ascertain conditions which will confront the American team on its arrival in Belgium next August.
