

Bracket in Golf Championship Proved to Be Well Balanced

IN STUDYING the bracket of the national amateur golf championship won last Saturday by Evans, some will say that Ouimet had the easier half of the bracket to wade through. In the first round Evans met F. C. Newton and Ouimet met R. Hickey; in the second Evans met Regis Lewis and Ouimet had M. J. Jack; in the third Evans clashed with Fownes and Ouimet with Armour, and in the semi-finals Evans played Ned Allis and Ouimet encountered Bobby Jones.

Evans had the more experienced and famous players to combat, as all were champions or ex-champions. He was the Staten Island title-holder and captain of the Massachusetts Leoley Cup team, besides having been a member of the invading team last spring that went to England for the British championship. Lewis is a former champion of Connecticut and Westchester County; Fownes is a former national champion and national medalist in 1914 and 1916, and Allis had been mid-summer champion of Wisconsin. Hickey and Jack, the first two Ouimet met, are practically unknown.

In the third round there was more equality in the opponents, Fownes against Evans being about equal to Ouimet against Ouimet. It was in the semi-final that Allis, who had started with a 74, did Evans, for Bobby Jones cannot but be ranked higher than Allis. So getting the rounds down to figures, one might say that Ouimet had two weaker opponents than Evans and one stronger, giving him a "margin of easiness" of 1, with one round, the third, equal.

Of last year's squad, the men to school are Jack Brown, Tom Liddle, Artie Schiaviano, Joe Kinney, Harry Mason, Bud Morrison, Jackson Ed, Thorman, Douglas Milne, Bud Kirkham, Paprocki, Freeze and Roscoe Rosenblum. Eugene Weber, the Manual and Marquand star, is coming back to school after finishing his high school education. Weber was at one time an all-scholastic player at Manual.

Mazel, who had planned to enter Williams, is down with pneumonia and probably will be out of football this fall.
