It was Guilford who was the holding champion wnen the national event was held recently at Brookline, and it was Sweetser who eliminated him from the championship.

Another contest that ought to provide some keen competition will be that between Frank W. Dyer of Upper Montclair, the New Jersey State champion, and Francis Oulmet of Boston, former holder of the national open and amateur crowns and one of the greatest players that the game has ever seen.
