## BAY STATE GOLFERS RETAIN LESLEY CUP

## Massachusetts Team Successfully Defends Trophy Against New York Players.

LOCUST VALLEY, L. I., Oct. 7.-The Massachusetts Lesley Cup golf team today accompilshed a remarkable feat here at the Piping Rock Country Club when it successfully defended the trophy against the assault of one of the strongest New York teams ever assembled to challenge since the trophy first was cast into the ring at Garden City back in 1905. At noon the eMtropolitan team had the comfortable lead of four points to one and not a soul except the Bay State contingent would have given a plugged nickle for the chances the holders had to retain their grip.

Never before had a team in this important series thus come from behind to gain a victory. Facing the necessity of winning seven of the ten afternoon singles matches, the Massachusetts team did even better than that, winning the seven and halving the other Buck Whittemore came from behind to square his match with Frank Dyer, the New Jersey champion, on the eighteenth green. cause Massachusetts then was assured of victory, they decided to call the match drawn, for a heavy rain was falling at the time. The final score was 8 points to 6. And so Massachusetts holds the trophy

for the fifth time in the sixteen years of its existence, New York having won it eight times and Pennsylvania three. This is the first time Massachusetts ever has held the cup two years in a row. It is the first time Massachusetts ever has been victorious on other than its own fairways.
