Francis Ouimet In Exhibition At Antlers—Public Is Invited.

At the Antlers Saturday afternoon, July 12, at 2 o'clock, Francis Ouimet, one of the world's most famous golfers will be seen in an exhibition four-ball foursome. Mr. Ouimet has been playing in Ditica with friends and is stopping over on his return to Boston. He will be paired with Herbert Norton, professional at the Utica Country club. The Amsterdam Golfer issue of July 1 in naming af all-time all-star golf team places Mr. Ouimet in fourth position and has the following to say:

Playing fourth on the all-time team we place Francis Ouimet of Boston. Brilliant resourceful and game to the core, with a thoroughly tested and reliable style, he answers to the requirements.

The conqueror of Vardon and Ray in 1913, when he led all American professionals, thereby taking the title of national open champion from an international field. National amateur champion in 1914.

He was also medalist at St. Louis last fall with a record score of 144 strokes. Medalist earlier in the season, qualifying for the Massachusetts state tournament. Winner by big margins over Oswald Kirkby and J. Wood Platt opponents in the Lesley cup matches. Teamed with Jesse Guilford against Duncan and Mitchell he scored rounds of 73 and 71 at Woodland. Over the exacting Myopia course against the same pair of Britishers he returned cards of 74-79 for a 153 total. Again, with Guilford as a teammate, in the Scotch foursomes at Hoylake, England, he won, as he did later in his individsal matches for the American team. Ouimet, with a distinguished record as a background, and a thoroughly sound game to lean upon, draws fourth place.

In addition to this he reached the semi-finals in 1923 in both the British and American amateur championships. Mr. Ouimet and Mr. Norton will have

as their opponents James Thompson of the Mohawk Golf club of Schenectady, a pupil of "Long Jim" Barnes, and a most spectacular player, and Gilman P. Tiffany of Amsterdam, who, last month at Toronto, won the International Rotary individual tournament, also the Columbia University club championship.

This is the first time since the visit of Vardon and Ray that Amsterdam is given an opportunity of seeing one of the golf top-notchers on the local course and for this reason the Antiers is extending an invitation to the public to witness this match.
