ANNAPOLIS, Md., Oct. 3 .- Winning from William and Mary by 25 to 0 here this afternoon in the opening game of the season, the Naval Academy, coached for the first time by Jack Owsley of Yale, showed greatly improved form over this time last season, the team being defeated by 14 to 7 in the initial game of last year. The Navy did not strike its pace early

and, though improvement along certain lines was evident from the start, there were some misgivings when the whole first quarter was passed without scoring it was not until late in the second period that Hamilton intercepted a pass and ran fifty-five yards, putting the Navy in striking distance of the goal. The visitors kept their goal line uncrossed during the third quarter, but in the final period the midshipmen hit their stride and scored three touchdowns on sensational plays.

The big feature of the quarter and the game was Shapley's run of seventy-flye yards for a touchdown after receiving the ball on one of Matsu's punts. It was the longest run in the career of that sterling player.
