

NEW YORK GOLFERS KEEP LESLEY CUP

**Amass Total of 67½ Points to
Lead Pennsylvanians, Who
Are Second, With 52½.**

MASSACHUSETTS TEAM 3D

**Canadians Finish Last in Pine
Valley Tourney — Homans
Shows Way for Victors.**

CLEMONTON, N. J., Oct. 4.—For the thirteenth time since the event was started in 1905 a picked squad of linksmen from the metropolitan district swept aside combinations representing Pennsylvania, Massachusetts and Canada at the Pine Valley Golf Club today, in the annual competition for the Robert W. Lesley cup.

The final tabulation of the two-day play gave the metropolitan stars a total of 67½ points, fifteen more than that amassed by the Pennsylvanians, who finished in the runner-up position with 52½ points. The Bay Staters were third with thirty-five counters while the Canadians brought up the rear with twenty-five.

The metropolitan golfers successfully defended the trophy which they captured last year at Toronto by exhibiting a marked superiority in the singles matches after being held fairly even in the best ball events by the Pennsylvanians.

Score 23 Points in Singles.

Today the metropolitan entries assembled a total of 23 points in the singles while Pennsylvania was second with 16, Canada third with 12 and Massachusetts last with 9. Four metropolitan luminaries scored clean sweeps over their single rivals from Pennsylvania, Massachusetts and Canada.

Gene Homans, runner-up to Bobby Jones in the recent United States amateur, defeated Elmer Ward, Massachusetts; Captain Jack Cameron, Canada, and Max R. Marston, former national amateur titleholder. The Englewood star shot 37, 37—74 to win.

T. Philip Perkins, former British amateur champion, who now resides in New York, scored 35, 36—71, one over par, to defeat Gordon Taylor Jr., the only Canadian to turn in a clean sweep yesterday; Elmer E. Lowery, Massachusetts, and Theodore R. Johnston, amateur champion of the local district.

Moffett Adds to Laurels.

Robert B. Moffett Jr., Long Island junior titleholder, turned back C. C. Frazier of Canada, W. P. Arnold, Massachusetts, and Spencer L. Jones, Pennsylvania, while Richard A. Jones was the fourth New Yorker to take three singles points by defeating B. L. Anderson of Canada, Sam Reed, Massachusetts, and Duff McCullough Jr., Pennsylvania.
