representing Pennsylvania, Massa-chusetts and Canada at the Pine Valley Golf Club today, in the annual competition for the Robert W.

nual competition for the Robert W. Lesley cup.

The final tabulation of the two-day play gave the metropolitan stars a total of 67½ points, fifteen more than that amassed by the Pennsylvanians, who finished in the runner-up position with 52½ points. The Bay Staters were third with thirty-five counters while the Canadians brough up the rear with twenty-five.

The metropolitan golfers successfully defended the trophy which they captured last year at Toronto by exhibiting a marked superiority in the singles matches after being held fairly even in the best ball events by the Pennsylvanians.
